Objective 2: Strategic Recommendations

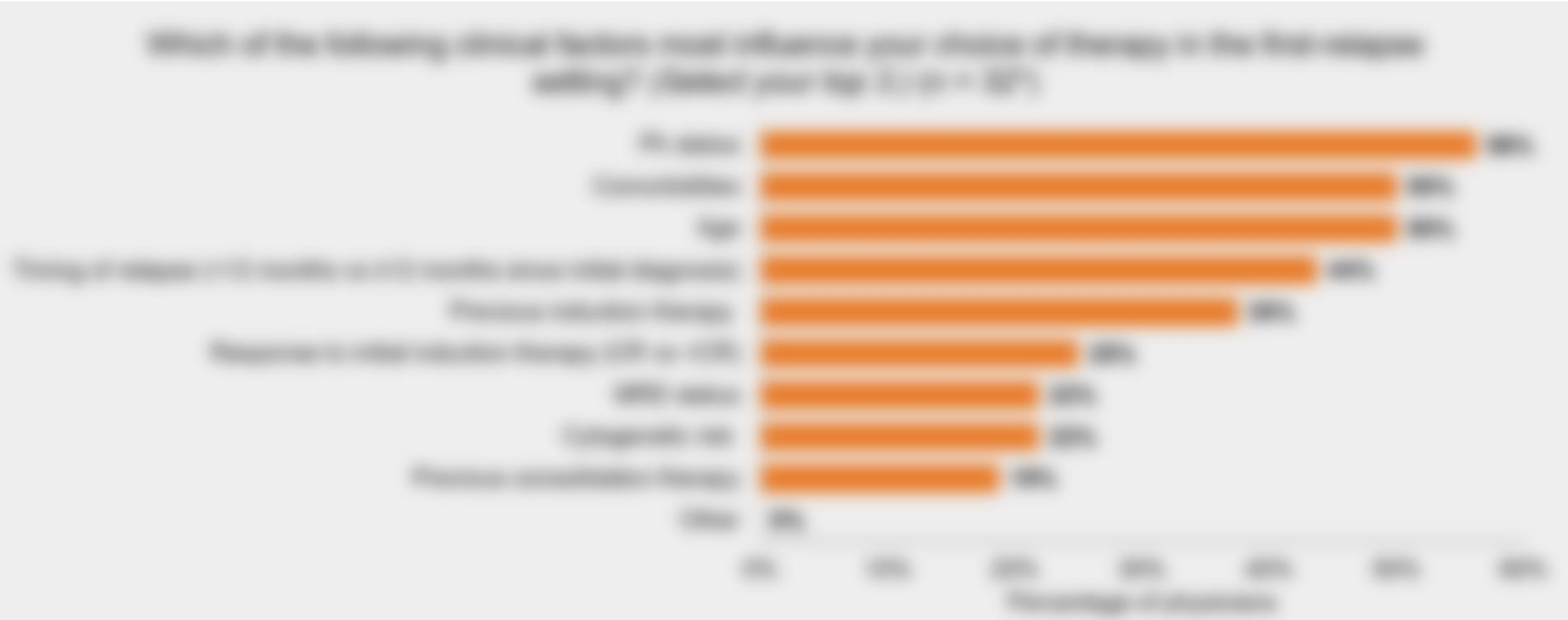

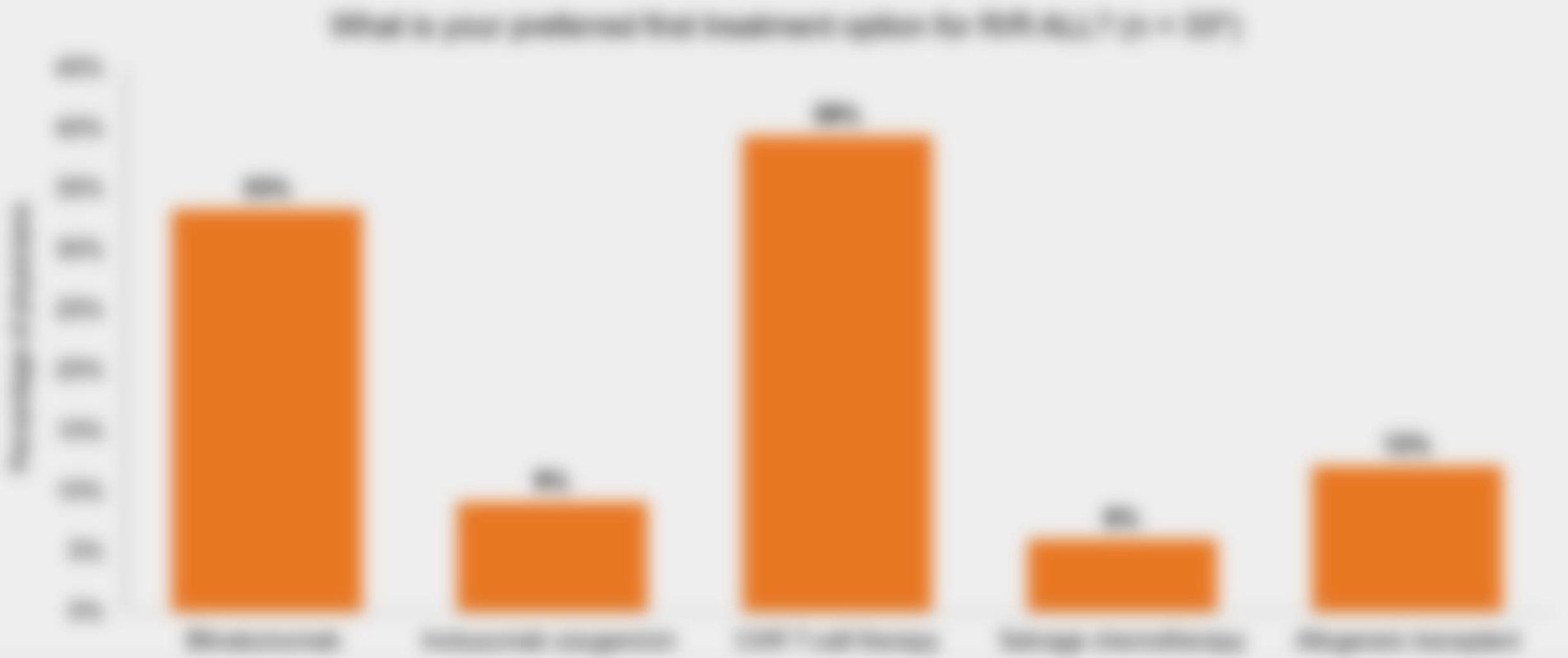

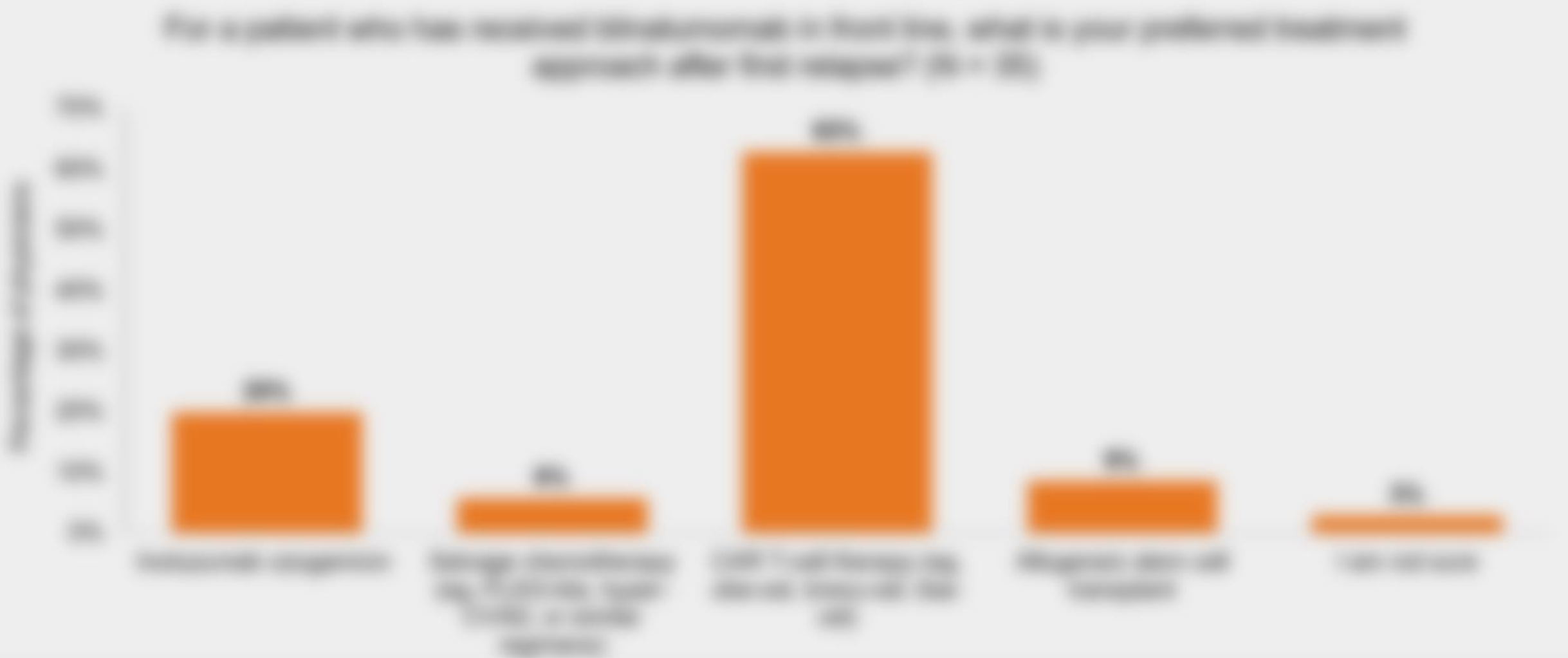

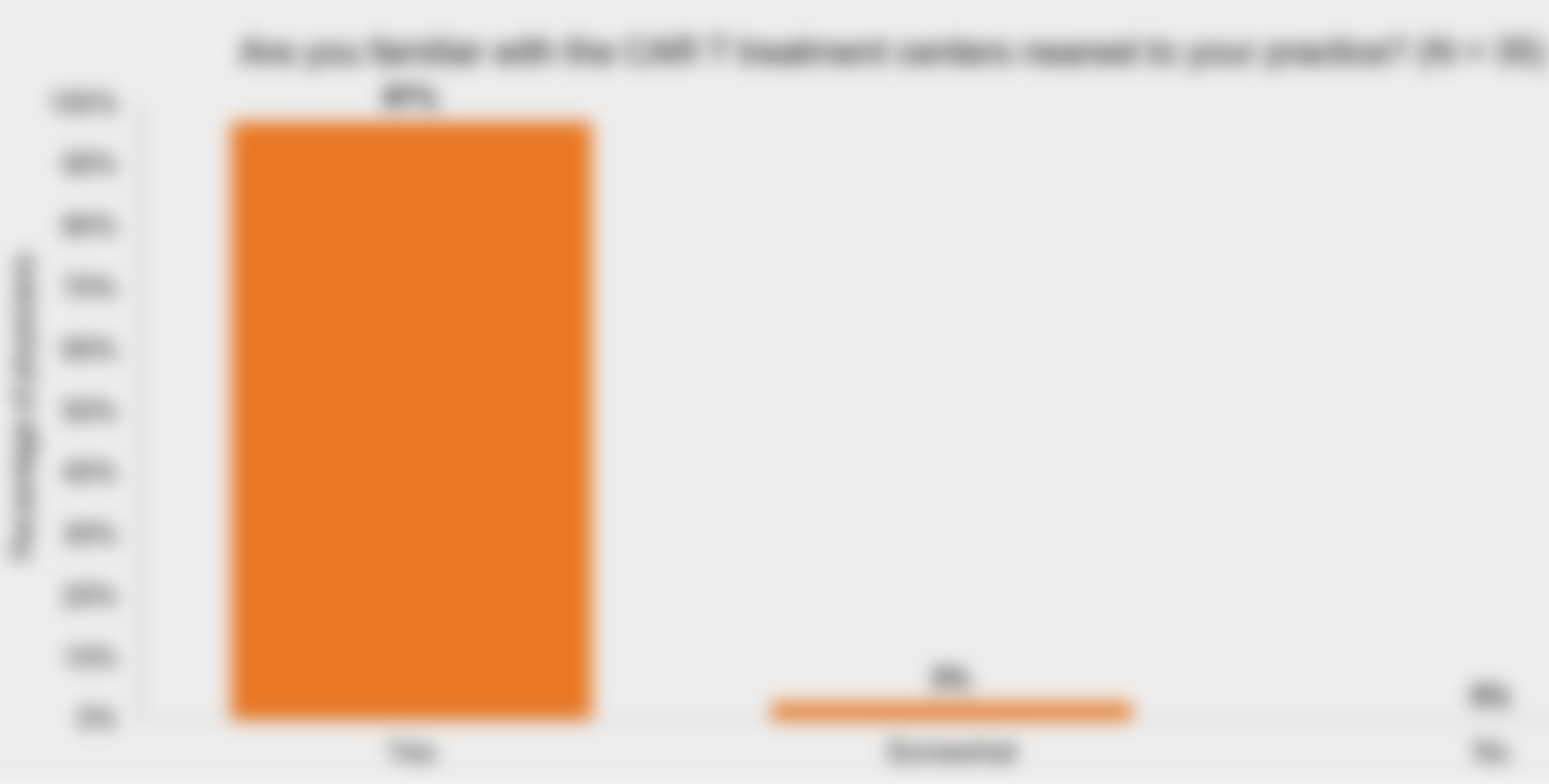
Most Physicians Prefer CAR T-Cell Therapy and Blinatumomab as the First Treatment Option for R/R ALL



Nearly Two-Thirds of Physicians Choose CAR T-Cell Therapy Upon Relapse After First-Line Use of Blinatumomab



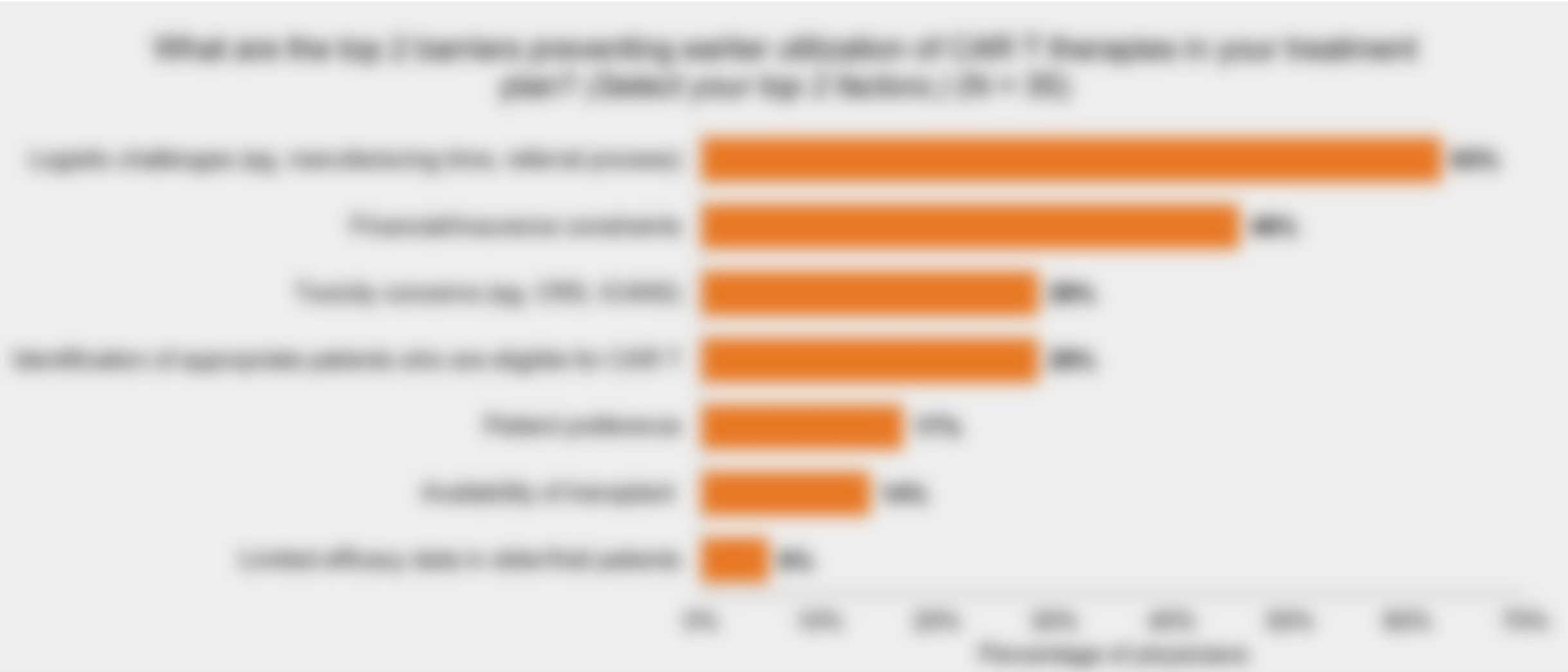
Nearly All Physicians Are Familiar With the Nearby CAR T Treatment Centers



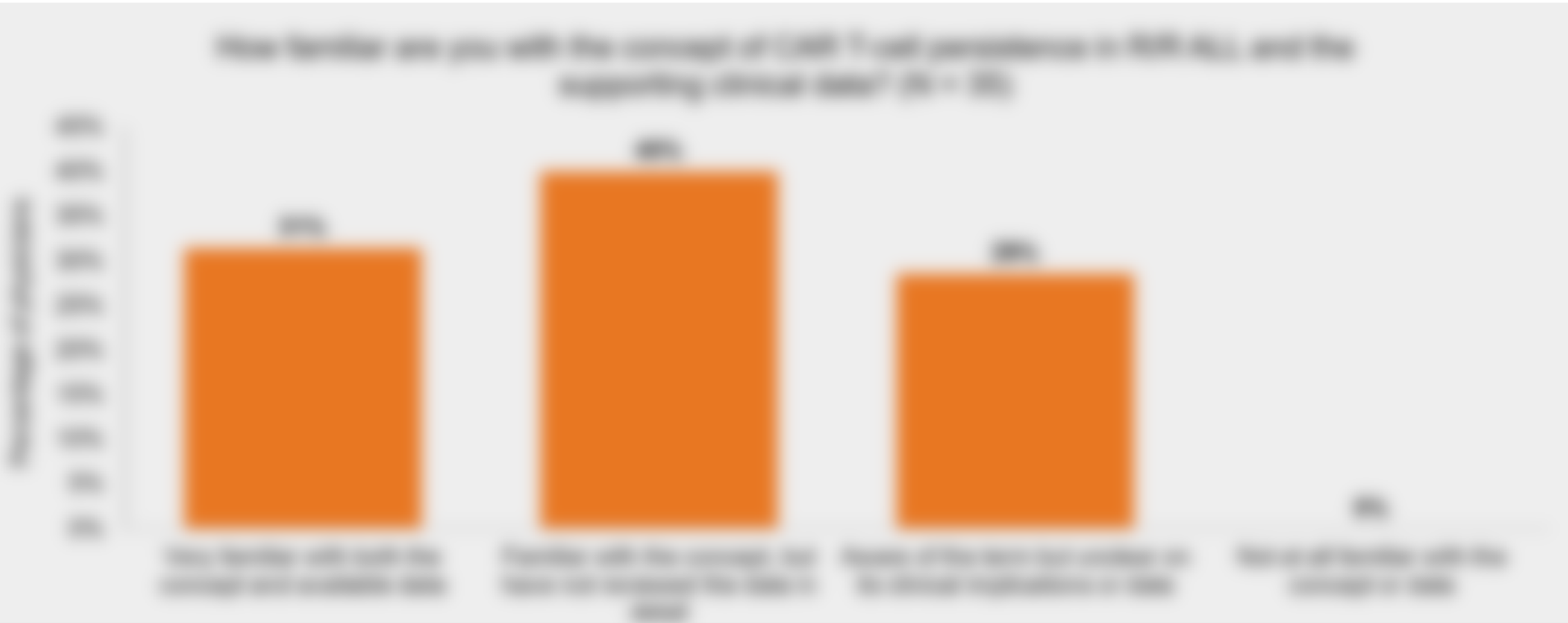

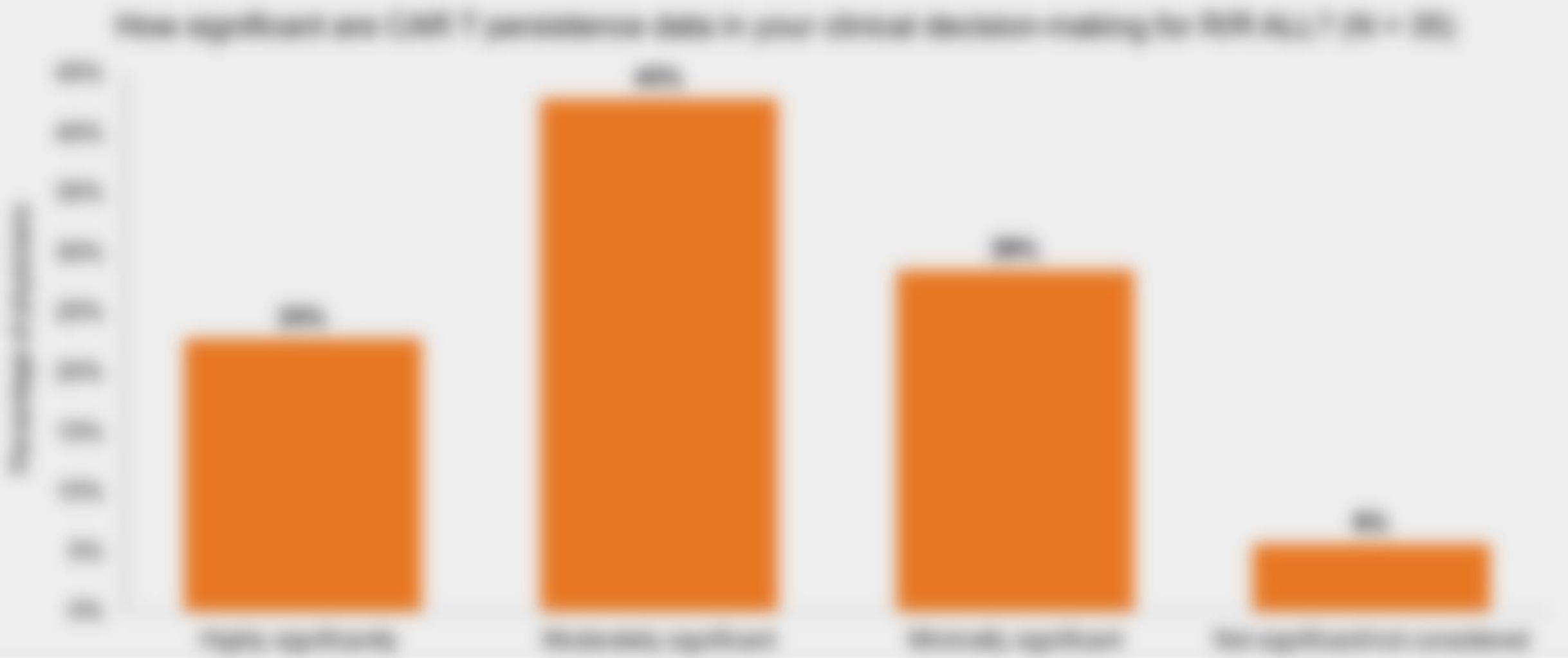

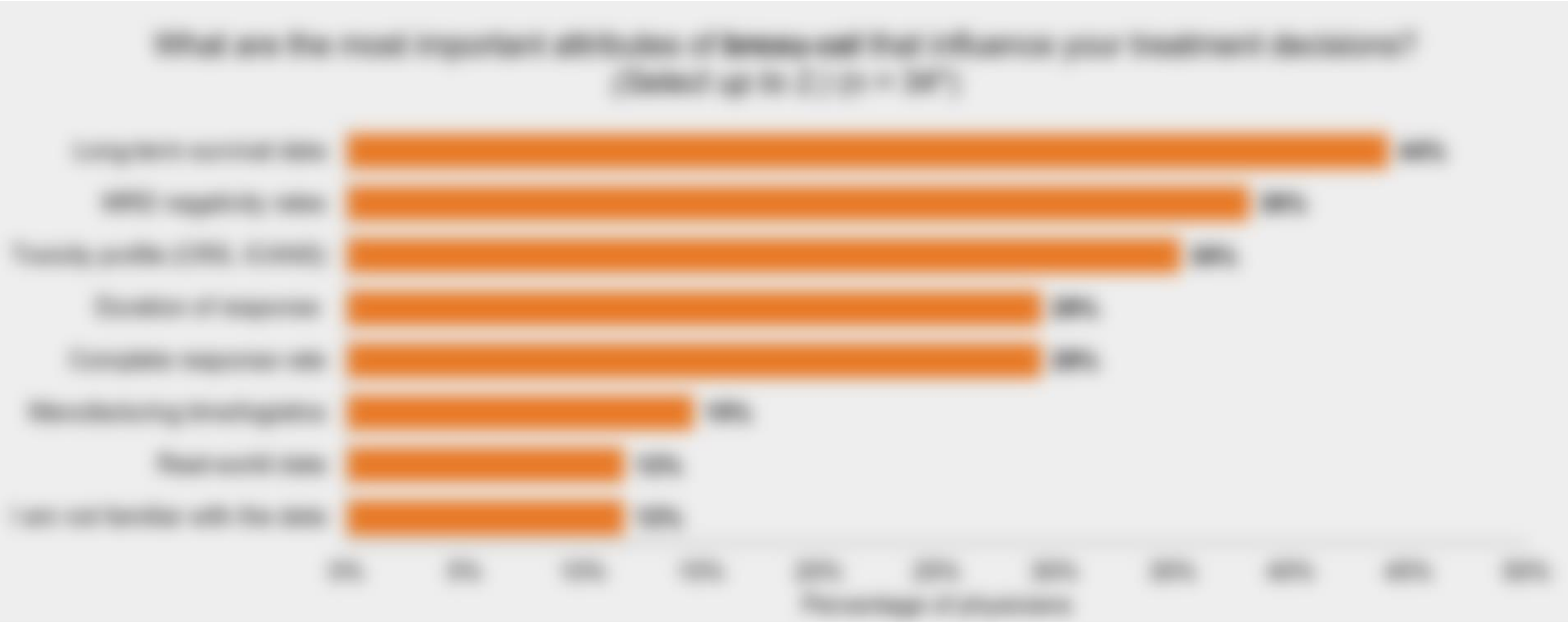

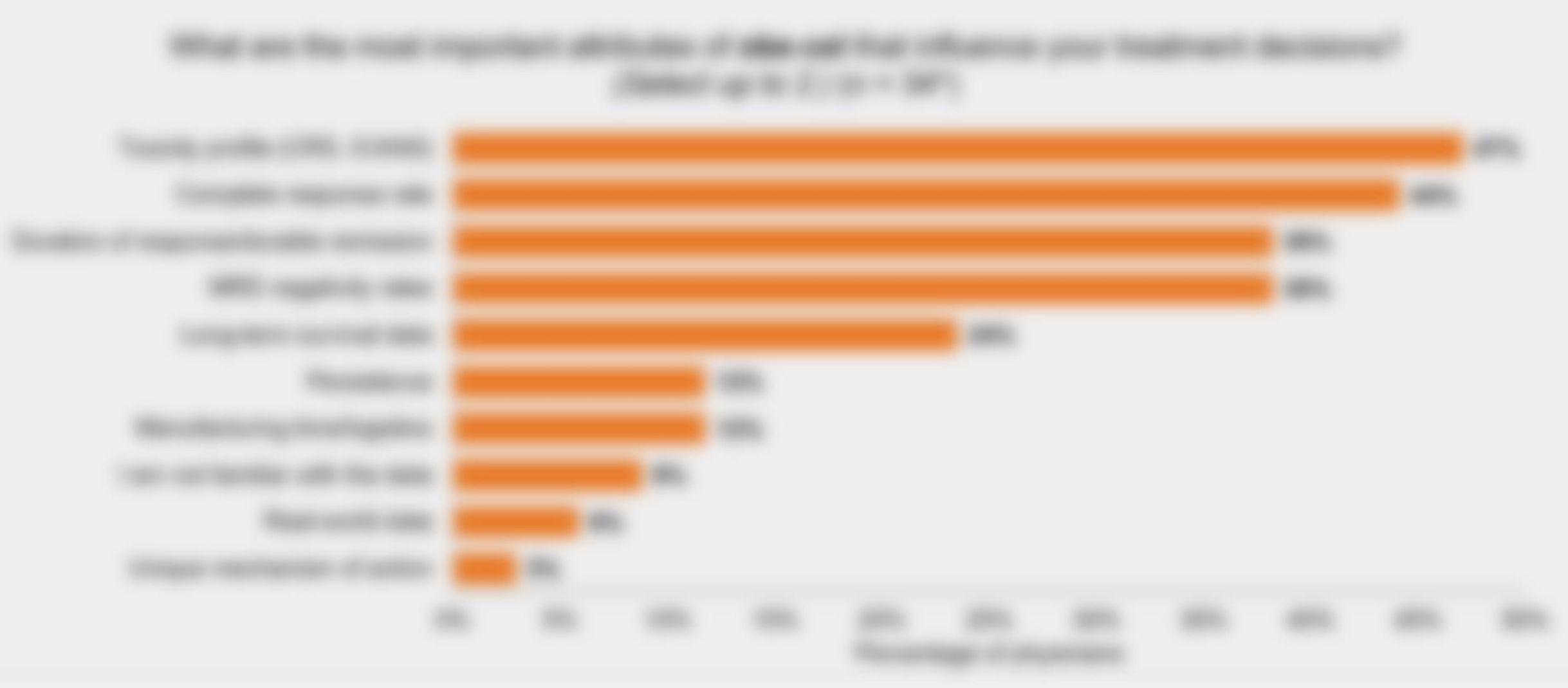

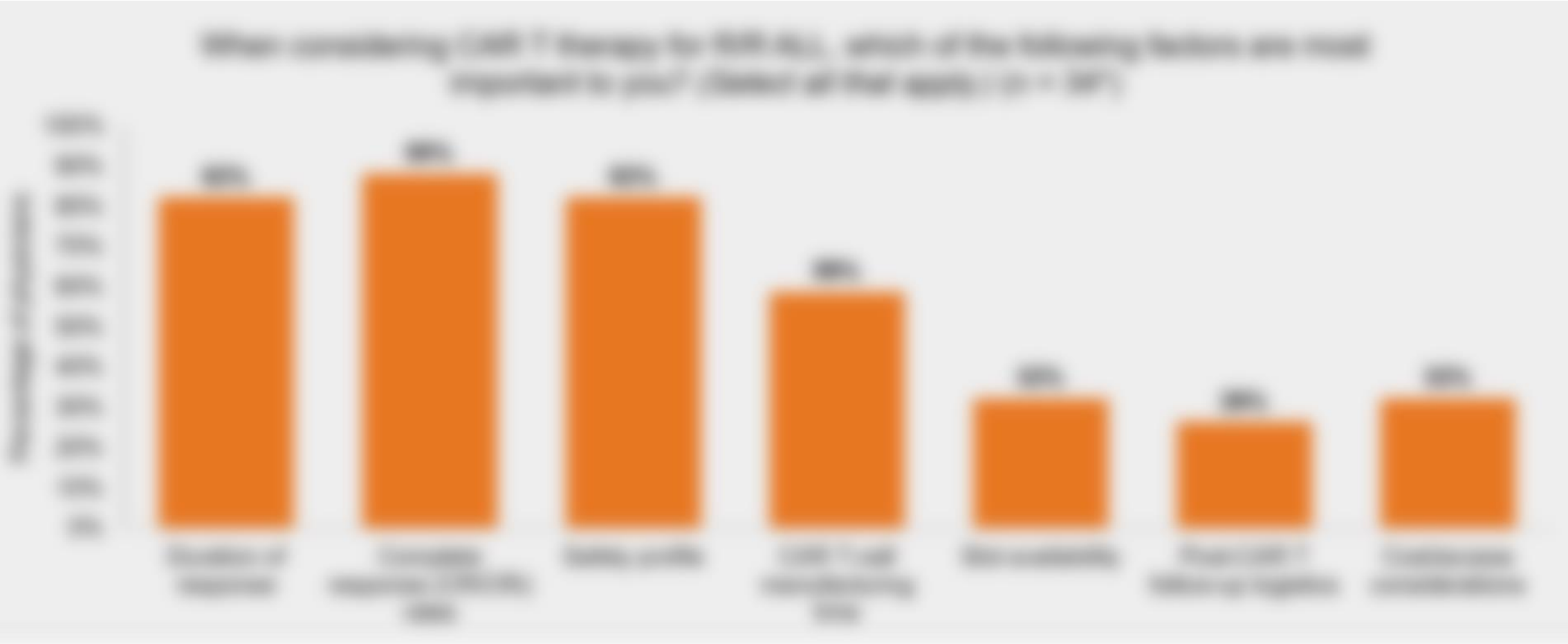

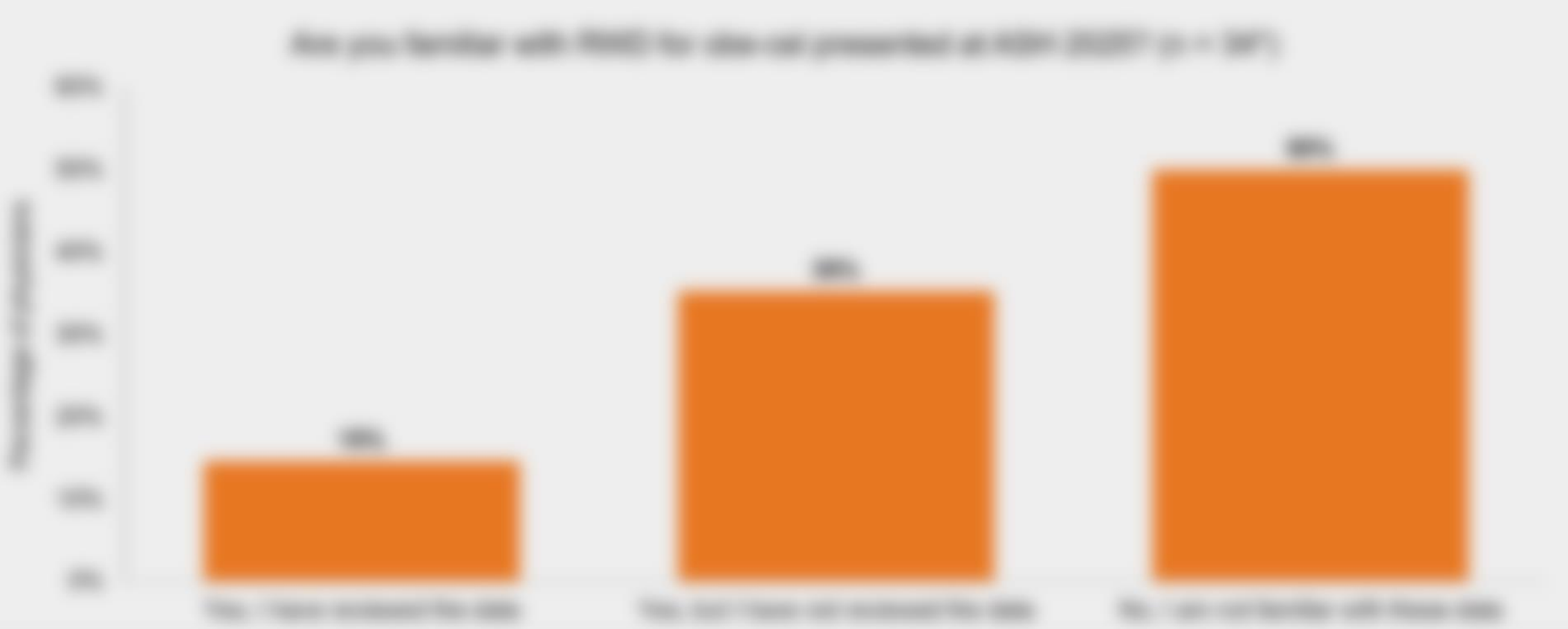

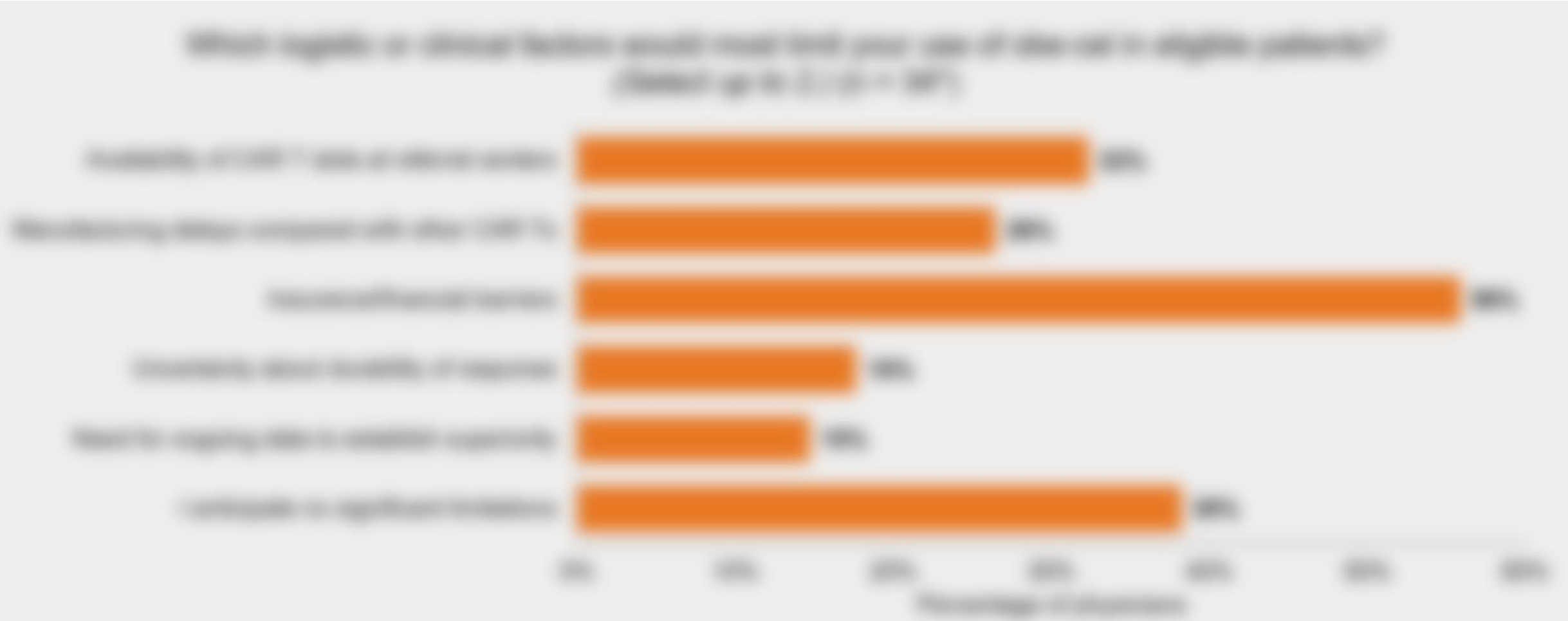
Figure 1: Obe-Cel is perceived to offer the most distinct advantage over current SOC CAR T options for R/R ALL when used before transplant as a definitive treatment (69%) and in patients ineligible for transplant (66%).
